The development has 35 individually designed apartments of various sizes, and two penthouses on the way, and while you can stay for the night like a hotel, it's especially geared towards medium and long-term residents who like to fly under the radar.

The place is great for Cold War enthusiasts. The apartments are not numbered, instead each is identified by a fictitious name, and guests remain anonymous under a pseudonym, with their own mailbox (a bit more convenient than a park bench dead-drop). We particularly like the bathrooms which mix beautiful yet subtle frescos with glazed brick tiles harking back to the building's turn-of-the-century origins. There's a high attention to detail throughout; a couple of examples are the pillow cases exclusively designed by fashion label Odeeh, and the complimentary bikes from Finnish firm Pelago.
